WHO ARE FOR CARDIFF?

We are a private, not-for-profit membership organisation which was voted for by the city's businesses in June 2016.

We began our first five-year term in December 2016 with an ambitious plan to transform Cardiff city centre.

WHAT ARE BIDS?

BIDs are an arrangement whereby businesses come together and decide which improvements they feel could be made in their city centre, and also how they will implement these improvements and what it will cost them. BIDs are financed and controlled by the businesses within the selected area.

BIDs can run for a maximum of five years and during this time they must be able to show that they are benefiting the businesses that fund it.



UPCOMING BALLOT

In June 2021, we asked businesses to reaffirm their commitment to FOR Cardiff and to improving the city centre through a vote to deliver a second term.

Our renewal ballot was successful with businesses voting 91% yes by number and 94% yes by rateable value.

In June 2026 FOR Cardiff will go to ballot again, with a new business plan asking businesses to commit to another 5 year term.

If successful this term will last from 2026-31, keep an eye on our channels to find out more about what we propose in this exciting next step!

WHY DO BUSINESSES SUPPORT BIDS?

BIDs have the ability to increase footfall to an area, reduce business costs and improve services. As they can run for up to five years they also give businesses the opportunity to plan ahead.

BIDs put the control into the hands of the businesses themselves. BIDs do not substitute services provided through business rates, they must provide additional services.

THE BID AREA

We operate within a defined geographical area across Cardiff city centre from Newport Road to Callaghan Square. Businesses within this area with a rateable value of over £25,000 pay a 1% levy to FOR Cardiff.

Our members cover a diverse range of businesses from the professional, retail, leisure, and educational sectors. We represent a voice for businesses and through our energy, leadership and influence we aim to respond to the needs of our members and improve Cardiff city centre for all.

The City Ambition fund is an opportunity for people, businesses, and organisations, who have an idea that aligns with FOR Cardiff's aims to access funding and see their projects come to life.

The fund was developed as a new project for our second term after we received feedback during consultation that levy payers wanted to see a more transparent and strategic allocation of our external funding.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME



Working in partnership with the Student Futures team at Cardiff University FOR Cardiff have developed an internship programme which will help to strengthen links between the university and local employers. This scheme builds on FOR Cardiff and Cardiff University's position as Real Living Wage employers and offers subsidised paid placements to Cardiff students in FOR Cardiff members.

FOR Cardiff members can access funding toward the cost of employing a student on a placement for between four and twelve weeks. The Student Futures team will work with you to develop a role profile, advertise the position to students and recent graduates, and help to sift applications if required.


FREE MEMBER TRAINING

Our fully funded training programme is one of our most in-demand projects, with hundreds of businesses saving thousands of pounds annually.

We offer a wide breadth of courses will be available to your staff at zero cost; from in-person training in **HABC Emergency First Aid At Work, HABC Level 2 Food Safety and HABC Level 2 Fire Safety** to e-learning courses on **conflict management, equality & diversity and GDPR**. Our online courses are fully flexible – allowing employees to complete them when and where suits them.

We also had excellent feedback on the floral decorations we have invested in during our first term and will continue to add a splash of colour across Cardiff streets via our hanging baskets and planters.

FOR Cardiff's Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) Strategy 2025 sets out a comprehensive plan to embed sustainability, equity and wellbeing across the city centre. Guided by the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act, the strategy aligns FOR Cardiff's activities with seven adapted wellbeing goals for a resilient, prosperous, equal, healthy, cohesive, culturally vibrant and globally responsible Cardiff.

The strategy builds on FOR Cardiff's track record of investment in social, environmental and economic projects, aiming to make the city safer, cleaner and more sustainable. It includes commitments to increase recycling, expand green spaces, and relaunch the Sustainability Hub to support circular economy practices. It promotes inclusive growth through training, internships, and fair pay while encouraging diversity through the Equality City Charter and workforce initiatives.

FOR Cardiff will continue to improve safety through schemes such as Taxi Marshals and Safe Places, support wellbeing via active travel and mental health programmes, and celebrate culture through bilingual communication and events. Environmental goals include exploring an urban solar farm, auditing members' sustainability practices, achieving carbon neutrality in operations by 2026 and moving to ethical banking.

This strategy demonstrates FOR Cardiff's leadership in connecting the private sector with Wales's wellbeing agenda and strengthening Cardiff's reputation as a forward-looking, inclusive and sustainable capital city.

A REPRESENTATIVE VOICE

Throughout our first term, FOR Cardiff has lobbied Welsh Government, South Wales Police and Cardiff Council on a plethora of city centre issues such as homelessness, antisocial behaviour and Covid 19 support, but we need to do more.

The challenges and threats to a significant proportion of our membership, have never been more poignant than they are now. If the support or financial packages and changes in policy are not significant enough, then the landscape of Cardiff will look very different.


As the representative body for businesses in the city centre, FOR Cardiff will work to position city centres high on government agendas, to ensure that Cardiff remains a vital and viable urban centre for generations to come.

An early indicator of our work in this area is our well received Recovery Manifesto for Cities and High Streets, which was launched in advance of the 2021 Senedd elections.

The manifesto outlined 8 priority areas for the Welsh Government to focus on, to ensure that city centres recover sustainably from the pandemic and overcome the challenges they were facing before the pandemic began. Facing city centres that were present before the pandemic began. Examples included a large-scale review of business rates, maintaining the benefits of good office environments, whilst transitioning to a blended and accessible working dynamic, and continuing to invest in developing high-quality public transport infrastructure.
